



Why was ISEI Formed?

Issues relevant to early intervention transcend national boundaries. Providing effective early intervention programs for vulnerable children and their families constitutes one of the most important challenges for contemporary societies. The knowledge base in early intervention for children with or at risk for delays or disabilities has grown considerably from contributions of researchers, clinicians, program developers, and policy-makers from numerous countries. Communication of these advances within and across national boundaries has improved in recent years. However, international early intervention collaborations and sharing of knowledge are far from adequate. ISEI's goal is to enhance the ability of early intervention professionals throughout the world to work together to advance early intervention concepts and practices.
